The World Social Forum will be turning 20 in 2021

We are now entering the second year of the covid-19 pandemic with the urgent need to mobilize social forces and expand fields of action. We shall strengthen emergency struggles and popular resistance, promote dialogues, defend alternatives, and align strategies of pressure for Another Possible World.

There is no time to waste !

What is expected of the WSF this year ?

- Improve the dynamics of the World Social Forum processes to better articulate social struggles and political advocacy;
- Extend the reach and inclusion of face-to-face and online dialogues;
- Expand visibility and inter-relationship of the actions and initiatives of resistance and transformation (struggles, projects, campaigns) that are being undertaken by participants during the process;
- Building the road to a future centralized world edition. Hence, there should be planned a proposal for a venue in Mexico by early 2022 that will incorporate the new technologies and forms of communication and participation.

About the Forum

It was born in 2001, by organisations and social movements that, from an initial proposal, mobilised for a meeting in Porto Alegre/Brazil. The main goal was to act as a counterpoint to the neoliberalism represented by the World Economic Forum, which has been held every year in Davos/Switzerland since 1971.

Besides the first editions in Porto Alegre (2001, 2002, 2003 and 2005), the WSF travelled the world with events happening in Mumbai, Caracas, Karachi, Bamako, Nairobi, Belém, Dakar, Tunis, Montreal and Salvador da Bahia. Thematic, regional and continental editions were also held.

The Forum process has been a space of expression for movements working towards a different globalization. There were 13 face-to-face WSF editions and a decentralized one that connected local events through online platforms in 2008. This year, for its 20th anniversary, the challenge is to hold the Forum in an entirely virtual way.

There are two collaborative instances of support to the Forum:

- The International Council of the WSF (IC)
- The International Facilitation Group (IFG)

The urgency of a World Social Forum in January 2021

Given the difficult international context, growing climatic and ecological disasters by human action, democratic emergencies, the covid-19 pandemic, and the impossibility of holding a face-to-face edition, the IC and GF decided to hold a virtual emergency edition of the World Social Forum in January 2021.

This edition of the WSF will take place between 23 and 31 January 2021. It has gone from the five days initially planned to a programming of nine days.

The aim is to make it possible to address the major issues brought by social struggles and ensure access and participation to all at accessible times.

The programme of the Virtual WSF 2021 will consist of general activities organized by the Facilitating Group and the International Council. There will also be self-managed activities proposed by social movements/organizations from all continents.

Space to visualise and interrelate lasting initiatives for another possible world, whether formulated as outcomes of Assemblies, Activities (statements and agendas) or formulated as descriptions of struggles, campaigns or transformation processes already existing and to be continued in 2021. (from 2pm to 4pm GMT)

Closing Event

Closing Activity that will launch the journey towards the next WSF in person, post-pandemic, and expected to take place by early 2022 in Mexico. (from 6pm to 8pm GMT)

How to participate?

You need to create a user account with login and password on the official website, confirm some data to access information and activities, register initiatives and then interact with the Virtual WSF, from 23 to 31 January 2021.

Important steps to follow:

1. Register as a participant
2. Register your organisation or social/collective movement (if you are the person in charge of it)
3. Register one or more activities that your organization will carry out during the WSF 2021
4. Register lasting initiatives "for another possible world" which will start or be continued in 2021 and could be presented at the WSF 2021

Register an activity

The activities can be workshops, panels, assemblies, exhibitions of experiences, debates, micro lectures, artistic and cultural performances, among other forms of online interventions, organized by one or more organizations.

These activities must/should advance various purposes such as those foreseen in the WSF Charter of Principles, Art. 1 (intensify reflection, hold a democratic debate of ideas, elaborate proposals, establish a free exchange of experiences and articulate effective actions).

Register an Autonomous Assembly

The Autonomous Assembly is an activity promoted by a group of proposing organisations. It must be registered to take place on January 30th.

Proposers must be registered and the title must bear the name "XXXX ASSEMBLY". The registration will be similar to the one for activities. A minimum of five applicant organisations are recommended.

Register an Initiative and participate in the Agora of the Futures

An initiative is a continuing action that can be registered separately (be it a campaign, struggle or a process of a continuous nature, may it be from one or several organizations) or a description of paths and lines of action in which the proposing organization is engaged, and which will take place during 2021.

Groups promoting Initiatives may announce their future action dates in 2021. These dates will form a calendar of the futures.

In the Agora of the Futures' space on January 31st, the initiatives can be found in your specific room. The Agora of the Futures' guide will be available starting from 23 January 2021.

Start of the day's column on the programme page

One (01) global 24-hour day, divided into six (6) columns of four (4) UTC hours (coordinated as universal time).

The "day" ends with the "world" column highlighted in blue (at 2pm UTC - 11am Brazil). In this image the vertical blue bar indicates the beginning of the day.

From it you have to check the time in your city and plan yourself accordingly.

Global activities will take place between 2pm and 4pm UTC.

The Virtual March will be a political, cultural and virtual event to open the Forum, where we will collectively occupy social networks around the world for social and economic justice, democracy and well-being!

Each Thematic Area is constituted by a Working Group (WG) self-constituted by participants of the WSF 2021 Facilitating Group.

When registering your Activity/Initiative, it will be necessary to associate it with up to three of the proposed thematic spaces, as well as up to three transversal themes.

These WGs have the following objectives:

- i) Collectively build the terms of reference in order to define/align the themes that will be addressed by thematic panels
- ii) Facilitate the organization of each Thematic Panel.

PROPOSING SELF-ORGANIZED ACTIVITIES

Planning, Mobilization, Articulation and Dissemination of Self-Organized Activities and Proposed Initiatives

- The information registered and described in the register will be the same as that which will appear in the agenda/convergence meetings/wSF initiatives for dissemination;
- The mobilization for the self-managed activity is the responsibility of the organizing group of the action (activity and initiative);
- Each proposing group defines the theme, the methodology of discussion, its digital logistics, the interpretation, the preparations and the relation with eventual preparatory activities between the 23th and 29th of January;
- The expected results or actions of an Activity or Assembly that will be formulated as an Initiative for 2021 should be disclosed at the time of the Agora (31th of January)
- Once an initiative has been announced by your group of promoting organisations, your name, your meeting room and the times when your promoting group will be present will appear in the "Guide to the Agora" (<https://join.wsf2021.net/agora>)

TRANSLATIONS | SUBTITLES

The Forum is an opportunity for dialogue with the rest of the world. The Forum's Facilitating Group makes sure that the official events of the WSF have simultaneous translation and/or subtitles in at least 4 languages:

English, Portuguese, French and Spanish.

Therefore, when thinking about registering your activity or initiative it is suggested to also provide simultaneous translation including the maximum number of languages proposed above, or subtitling.

THE CHARTER OF PRINCIPLES <https://wsf2021.net/fsm2021/340-2/>

The registered organisations must read the charter and respect the principles of the WSF set out in it.

All registered activities should be aligned with the World Social Forum Charter of Principles.

It contains the definitions, values, goals, generics of the participating entities and purposes guiding this collective construction.

The Charter is composed of 14 principles.

THE CHARTER OF PRINCIPLES

The Committee of Brazilian entities that organized the first World Social Forum, held in Porto Alegre from the 25th to 30th January of 2001 considers it necessary and legitimate, after analyzing the results of that Forum and the expectations it created, to establish a Charter of Principles that will guide the continuity of that initiative.

The principles contained in the Charter - which must be respected by all those who wish to participate in the process and by those who are part of the organization of the new editions of the World Social Forum - consolidate the decisions that presided over the Porto Alegre Forum, which guaranteed its success and broadened its scope, defining guidelines based on the logic of those decisions.

- 1** The World Social Forum is an open space of meetings to: intensify reflection, hold a democratic debate of ideas, elaborate proposals, establish the free exchange of experiences and articulate effective actions on the part of entities and movements of civil society that oppose neoliberalism and the domination of the world by capital or any form of imperialism, and that are also committed to the construction of a planetary society oriented towards a fruitful relationship between human beings and between them and the Earth.
- 2** The World Social Forum in Porto Alegre was an achievement situated in its time and space. From now on, from the proclamation in Porto Alegre that "another world is possible", the Forum becomes a permanent process of search and construction of alternatives, not limited exclusively to the events that sustain it.
- 3** The World Social Forum is a global process. All the events that take place in this process will have an international dimension
- 4** The alternatives proposed at the World Social Forum are opposed to a process of globalization, led by large multinational companies and by governments and institutions that serve their interests, with the complicity of national governments. These alternatives that have emerged within the Forum aim to consolidate a globalization in solidarity that, as a new stage in the history of the world, respects universal human rights, all citizens of all nations and the environment, supporting international democratic systems and institutions that are at the service of social justice, equality and the sovereignty of peoples.
- 5** The World Social Forum brings together and articulates civil society entities and movements from all countries of the world, but it does not claim to be a representative body of global civil society.
- 6** The meetings of the World Social Forum are not deliberative in nature. In other words, no one is authorized to express, on behalf of the Forum and at any of its meetings, positions that have been attributed to all its participants. Participants should not be called upon to take decisions, by vote or acclamation - as a group of Forum participants - on declarations or proposals for action that include all or a majority and are proposed as decisions of the Forum as such.
- 7** Thus, it must be ensured that the entities participating in the Forum meetings are free to deliberate - during the meetings - on the declarations and actions they decide to develop, alone or together with other participants. The World Social Forum commits itself to widely disseminate these decisions, by the means at its disposal, without guidelines, classifications, censorship or restrictions, clarifying that they are deliberations of the entities themselves.
- 8** The World Social Forum is a plural and diverse, non-confessional, non-governmental and non-partisan space, which articulates itself in a decentralized and networked manner, entities and movements that are involved in concrete actions for the construction of a different world, local or international.

THE CHARTER OF PRINCIPLES

9 The World Social Forum will always be a space open to the plurality and diversity of the actions of entities and movements that wish to participate, as well as to the diversity of genders, ethnicities, cultures, generations and physical capacities, provided that the Charter of Principles is respected. Party representations or military organizations should not participate in the Forum. Governors and parliamentarians who make commitments under this Charter may be invited to participate in a personal capacity.

10 The World Social Forum is opposed to any totalitarian and reductionist vision of the economy, development and history and to the use of violence as a means of social control of the State. It advocates respect for human rights, the practice of true participatory democracy, equality, solidarity and peaceful relations among people, ethnic groups and genders, condemning all forms of domination or submission of one human being to another.

11 The World Social Forum, as a space for debate, is a movement of ideas that stimulates reflection and a transparent dissemination of the results following the reflection on the mechanisms and instruments of the domination of capitalism on the means and actions of resistance and improvement. It is also reflecting on the alternatives proposed to solve the problems of exclusion and social inequality that are being created, both internationally and within countries by the processes of capitalist globalization, including its racist, sexist, destructive and anti-environment dimensions.

12 The World Social Forum, as a space for exchanging experiences, stimulates mutual knowledge and recognition of the participating entities and movements, valuing the exchange, especially of what society is building to focus on economic activity and political action. Attention is raised to the needs of human beings and respect for nature, both for the present generation and for the future ones.

13 The World Social Forum, as a space for articulation, seeks to strengthen and create new national and international articulations among entities and movements of society, that increase - both in the public and private spheres - the capacity of non-violent social resistance to the processes of dehumanization that the world is experiencing and State violence. Furthermore, it seeks to strengthen the initiatives of humanization that are underway through the actions of these movements and entities.

14 The World Social Forum is a process that encourages the participating entities and movements to place their local and national actions before international organizations, such as the issues of planetary citizenship, notably by presenting the transforming practices they are experiencing for the construction of a new world of solidarity
